I hope you all have a much-deserved Christmas holiday break, but before you do don't forget there is our final 2018 Business Meeting for the year on 19 December.



Notes from our dinner meeting November 7, 2018

Pavilion room @ Dannemora Gardens

Prom time to time our Lions club invites a guest speaker who could be given a gold star for content, interest & relevance, and Colleen Brown at this dinner meeting was one such speaker.

At (almost) the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day of 1918 Colleen Brown told us about her book which delves into the story of the 'Bulford kiwi' - why a group of NZ soldiers stationed at Sling Camp in Bulford, England, in 1919 cut into the chalk of a nearby hill a large image of a kiwi and the letters 'NZ' while



waiting desperately for a ship to carry them home from World War I.



Colleen Brown says she became aware of the story from hearing about her great uncle Bertie Jarrett, a Kiwi soldier who died of influenza in Sling Camp in Bulford. Her 176-page book is dedicated to him. "I had all these stories about Bertie and my great-grandfather going down to

meet his boat, finding out (his son) Bertie had died, and being shocked and never

recovering. That was family folklore."

The Bulford Kiwi, which stretches out over four & a half acres (1.8 hectares) commemorates the lives lost and sacrifices made in that war. The carving, still visible across the Salisbury Plains and just 15 minutes drive from Stonehenge,, has been made a scheduled

monument by the UK
Department for Culture,
Media and Sport.

As we listened and watched
Colleen's insightful, personal video
presentation we were greatly impressed by
the amount & detail of research Colleen had
done to gather the story threads together and

then form a fascinating & historic account about the energy, labour & purpose which lay behind 'The Kiwi we left behind'.

Thank You Colleen Brown for sharing with us this profound event in New Zealand's military past.

Camp Quality is dedicated to bringing fun, hope and happiness to the lives of children aged 5 to 16 living with cancer, their families and communities, through provision of high quality recreational experiences

The goal is to provide fun and comradeship combined with achievable challenges to encourage the children to focus on the positive aspects of their lives and provide a sense of normality & independence.

Each year CQ runs week-long residential programmes throughout New Zealand. It strives to provide a safe and secure environment involving one-on-one support from Companions and by the provision of committed, well trained staff on all camping activities with regular camp locations situated in: - Auckland/Northland, Waikato/Bay of Plenty, Wellington/Central Districts, Christchurch, South. Each year around 300 children aged from 5 to 16 years attend one of the camps.

Camp Quality is a totally voluntary organisation with no individual receiving remuneration and thousands of hours each year go into raising funds and organising programmes. Each camp has a minimum of two Paediatric Oncology trained staff in attendance.

Lions Clubs of New Zealand are committed Partners with Camp Quality New Zealand.

will be inevitable".



The Trust has become the Multiple District resource for the charitable work of the Lions of New Zealand. It benefits sick, disabled or distressed people in New Zealand and the Pacific Islands. It also helps in the field of education. It has been able to assist with numerous appeals and projects and hundreds of thousands of dollars have been given to Lions clubs by way of grants or loans to assist with a multitude of club projects.

The Trust earns its income from a variety of investments that form part of a significant capital base which continues to be built up with ongoing Lions Club support. The Capital Fund cannot be touched so it grows each year. The larger the Capital Fund grows the greater the income available to help with Lions Clubs projects.

There are three levels of honours granted by LMLCCT to nominated members of all clubs, their families and such other persons within the community whose contribution to Lions deserves special recognition.




