# POLICY CODE





## Meetings:

Two scheduled meetings shall be held each month February to December inclusive on the first and third Wednesdays at designated venues.

The Dinner Meeting to be held on the first Wednesday at 6.30 for 7.00pm. The Business meeting to be held on the third Wednesday at 7.00pm.

## **Board Meetings**

: Responsibilities of the Board shall include:

**1)** .Formulating new Business and policies for presentation to and approval by the Club members.

2) Authorising all Club expenditure.

**3)** Appointing delegates to District and Multiple District Conventions.

## Attendance:

To qualify for 100% attendance a member shall attend all scheduled meetings of the Club.

Make-ups will be granted in accordance with the standard make-up rules for attendance at meetings within thirteen days either side of the missed meeting.

## Finance)

- 1) Cheque Signatures; Will be any two of the President, Secretary, Treasurer or other appointed officer.
- 2) Emergency Funds: The President, together with the Vice Presidents may in the event of an emergency





situation commit the Club to expenditure up to \$250.00 for later ratification by the Club.

3 Convention Expenses; a) Business session registration fees for delegate will Be paid for by the Club from the Convention account.

b) Multiple District Convention: Full registration expenses for the President and wife will be paid from the Convention account.


4) Presidents expenses: When the President is invited to attend Official Lions functions or meetings to represent the Club, the expenses will be re-imbursed to a maximum of \$700.00 in any one fiscal year, to be reviewed in the light of any special circumstances arising.

**Guests.** Meals will be complimentary for the District Governor, Vice District Governor and any District Cabinet member on an official visit, the Guest Speaker's any overseas visiting Lion Member.

Refreshments for the Guest Speaker will be re-imbursed from club funds.

**<u>Recommendation</u>**: That this policy be reviewed annually and published in the Tatler each July.

## 100% Attendance Awards;

These awards are given to members who achieve 100% continuous attendance at Club meetings. They are a way

of recognising the commitment and involvement of Lions who are fortunate to have such time available for Lions activities

In the words Past International President Sobral' "Make your Fellow man feel needed!".

If a meeting is missed a "make-up" can be made within 13 days prior to or after the missed meeting by attending any of the following::-

Any meeting scheduled or sponsored by the members home Club including fund raising and service activities.

Any International, State or District Convention or other recognised Lions meeting

A Lion who visits Lions Clubs International H.Q. Oak Brook, any State or District Office outside the Lion's home Country

- \* A lion who is unable to attend by reason of illness.
- A member whom is forced to miss meetings, as a result of military service, jury duty, elected government position or other statutory requirement





Any Lion who finds it necessary, or is assigned to perform occupational duties in a place from which he/she cannot readily attend a lions Club meeting.

In each case the board of Directors shall decide if credit should be given for the missed meeting (s)

Customarily our Club's membership committee and/or secretary use a common sense approach." to give credit on the basis of observing the "spirit of the law and considering: Is it fair to the other Lions, to the Club or to the spirit of Lionism?

The situation often arises that a member with some years of 100% may miss for a period. This does mean that the member "starts' again as continuity has been broken.

However members are still perfectly entitled to wear the previously earned pin or pins and also their "service chevrons indicating years of service.

Remember attendance is not a means to end in itself but a means of sustaining involvement and interest in all aspects of Lions activities and fellowship.


