

More from our Combined Lions Dinner @ DMG

Wednesday August 7, 2019

Our guest speaker for the evening, Fiona Alexander, gave the gathered Lions an orderly and polished account of the history, developing evolution & restoration of the recreation reserve on our Hauraki Gulf island, Motuihe. Fiona Alexander is a volunteer Day Coordinator for the Motuihe Island Restoration Trust who, with many other volunteers, since 2000 has given her skills, knowledge & enthusiasm to the restoration of this 'island paradise' only 30 minutes by ferry from the CBD.

This Trust Restoration Project is in partnership with DOC to renovate the island over 25 years back to an



authentic (near-original), natural ecosystem for native NZ flora & fauna - e.g. kiwi, tuatara, gecko etc. Kiwi & Tuatara are increasing; Penguins are nesting again, rabbits have been eradicated & much gorse has been removed.

450,000 trees have been planted;

Many of us were surprised when we heard of the varied & apparent disorderly human history of Motuihe, from 1872 when the NZ government established a quarantine station there (pandemics and plagues). Over the years... it was privately owned; an internment location during WW1 for 'doubtful

foreign nationals'; a camp for earthquake-affected orphans; a military Naval base & a period of limited farming.

This was an enlightening & entertaining address. Fiona Alexander was presented with a cheque, which will buy another surveillance camera for increased pest & predator control on our Motuihe Island.

back page).


Tony hopes all LIONS will be able to help with these four fundraising shifts. But it does mean that some
