Enough Charitable Trust", demonstrated to us how a 'specialist' in community service could also make a real difference. With powerful expression Sonja Wellbach addressed our meeting on the issue of 'Digital Coping Strategies for Young People'.

We were asked "WHAT IS DIGITAL ANXIETY?"

We were then given a comprehensive and polished audio-visual presentation on the mission & methods of the 'I'm Enough' charity to provide the tools to support folks being harshly influenced by personal postings through our contemporary social media. Online harassment is always present



- instantly - and affects everyone, especially young girls, with peer pressure "to measure up" a significant problem. Our guest's organisation clearly has a good handle on the impact, both positive & negative, social media can have on all people, those engaged directly, and also those connected but on 'the outside'.

The 'I'm Enough' charity's messages of hope & support work through a range of media - cell phone, website, workshops, and the charity links with professional experts in a range of different fields to address the mental, emotional, physical, social & spiritual health of individuals connected in digital conversations.

With modern digital connectivity significantly influencing our social lives there would appear to be a solid link between

social media activity and our emotional well-being. The 'I'm Enough' charity has chosen to serve the needs of teens,

particularly, so they can firmly believe "they are enough".

After this ceremony the Salts took the Stockings to a vineyard for lunch then to some Far North beaches. It was a great fun weekend and a well run convention.



It's now getting closer to Christmas and members could be beginning to focus elsewhere, but Howick Lions still have some serving to do before a holiday, especially those members who are at the core of any Lions event organising. E.g. Our club Christmas dinner is coming up on December 4 & arrangements are almost in place; entertainment, decorations, theme, the menu has yet to be announced; we're expecting a good attendance. The Senior Citizens Christmas Lunch is also'in plan'. It was suggested we use our Lions Christmas cakes as raffle prizes, but these are considered too large & we can easily source smaller, cheaper gifts with better variety. We will also refurbish the hall decorations, as many we have are past their use-by date. This will be done on the day.

Our club's commitment to Camp Quality will mean two dates to help with the children; one for breakfast at the Paerata Camp & one to cook hot chips at the Family Day at the AUT Camp (see club calendar for dates & times).

It seems our Lions Club Christmas cakes are not moving as quickly as we would prefer; members are asked to give more support to Agnes who has given this project her full & committed attention.

Grant reviewed the 'Christmas Lights' project. The cancellation was nothing to do with Howick Lions, with decisions outside our control. Auckland Council evicted everything & everyone from the 'old library' building stating it was unhealthy & unsafe. This included all the Christmas Lights decorations, which went temporarily to the RSA. But they were in such a disorderly state there was no prospect of setting up a quality display in the time, especially when the manpower to do that was limited mostly to a few keen & active Lions club members. Our club is sincerely disappointed with the decision by the HVA Lights Trust to cancel. Grant was applauded for his long-term efforts with this project.

There are also sausages to sizzle through December & January. We declined the opportunity to go out West and cook hot chips for Waterlea school, and have reluctantly been unable to put a 'team & theme' together to march in the Howick Santa Parade. Maybe next year.

Our club's Water Safety Picnic project is awaiting confirmation of the high tide date at Cockle Bay (at about 11am) in March; the scouts will pick the best tide time & date and we

can then plan our contribution.

President Paul reviewed the Fund-Raising & Project suggestions put forward by members in a previous meeting, and member Lions will be asked to rank these ideas by categories in priority order of need & practicality.

The club's trailer, currently being housed by Dave Downie, will need to find a new (permanent & secure) home by the end of January; Dave won't be able to keep it at his place after this date.

President Paul is asking all member Lions to seriously consider accepting a senior role in the management of our Lions club in the coming Lions year (July 2020-June 2021). We will need a new President, Vice-President & Secretary to be identified by our March business meeting; formally elected in April. (Grant will be unable to accept next year's presidential position as he will be on extended leave for 4 months.) These positions carry a prominent level of status across our Lions District and also provide good conditions for personal leadership growth.

PDG Ian Packwood will be in hospital (Mercy) for a few days for an operation. We wish our Packy a speedy recovery.

The first Camp Quality was established by founder Vera Entwistle in 1983 in Sydney, Australia. English-born Vera (1933-2009) was responsible for introducing Camp Quality to seventeen countries worldwide, including New Zealand. The name 'Camp Quality' is believed to have come from a motto statement attributed to founder Vera: - "No-one can do much about the quantity of anyone else's life, but everyone can do something about the quality."

The mission of Camp Quality is to provide children living with cancer and their families with a support network.



Camp Quality (NZ) Inc. is a Charitable Trust established in 1985, with the first camp held in West Auckland and attended by 22 children from throughout New Zealand. CQ (NZ) is dedicated to bringing fun, hope and happiness to the lives of children aged 5 to 16 living with cancer, their families & communities, through the provision of high quality recreational experiences. The hot air balloon in the logo symbolises the ability to rise

above life's challenges. Each year Camp Quality runs week-long residential programs in five locations throughout New Zealand which strive to provide a safe and secure environment involving one-on-one support from Companions, and by the provision of committed, well-trained staff on all camping activities. Each year about 300 children attend one of the camps. As a volunteer organisation Camp Quality has a number of supporters both small and large and receives financial support, help in kind, and physical assistance.

Lions Clubs of New Zealand are Friends & Supporters of Camp Quality with senior Lions sometimes occupying positions on local administrative boards. Each January CQ (Auckland/Northland) asks for extra volunteers from District 202K Lions clubs to help with chores

during the camps at Wesley College & Family Fun Days. It has long been a tradition for Howick Lions to pitch in with these CQ activities with "our sleeves rolled up".

Howick Lions serve Camp Quality Summer Camps

Message received by Rex from Debbie Laidlaw, CQ (abridged)



Good afternoon Rex,

Our CQ camp will be running from <u>Saturday 11th to Friday 17th of January.</u> We are expecting to be feeding approximately 68 campers; with all their companions and other staff we will be topping 200 this year.

We are looking forward to having your Howick Lions team come and help us. Our address is <u>Wesley College 801 Paerata Road, Paerata</u>.

We have booked your team in for two (2) sessions.

- 1. Sunday 12th* from 9.30 to approximately 2pm. We will be at the AUT campus in Manukau. The address is 640 Great South Road, Manukau. We are not sure on numbers of attendees yet; when I find out I will let you know.
- 2. <u>Tuesday 14th*</u> from 7am till approximately 10 am at Wesley College, Paerata.

We have health and safety rules that must be followed for the safety of the campers and ourselves. Please bring these to the attention of your team (Aroha or myself will go over them again at your induction briefing when you arrive).

- * Helpers can have no recent illnesses, such as a cold or the flu. (Some children may have low immunity and can easily catch viruses).
- * Everyone must wear covered shoes, so no sandals or jandals. If you do come with this kind of footwear you will have to be found jobs outside the kitchen area itself; e.g. in the dining room or helping elsewhere in camp where open toed shoes are accepted.
- * no smoking or vaping is permitted on site.
- * No alcohol is permitted on site.
- * no photos to be taken while on site. Photos of your team will be taken by the Camp photographer or myself. If I take any of your team I will forward them to your secretary.
- * Please leave your mobile phones in your car or bag. (We will have a safe area for your personal belongings).
- No entering the campers' dormitories.

We will need about five or six of you to be helpers this year. If you do bring more, that is fine, but please be aware that they may end up in areas not associated with the kitchen. I.e. crafts, laundry etc.

Please report to the kitchen when you arrive as we need to have everyone sign in, do our on-site Health and Safety talk, catch up with what everyone has been doing over the year and give you the all-important visitor badge before we hit the ground running.
