

At this meeting we had one such moment when our most senior active Lion PDG 'Packy' formally inducted Jan Tait into the global volunteer fellowship of Lions Clubs International. With Jan's sponsor Colin on

Also very welcome was our primary guest speaker for this evening (organised by PP Derek), Duncan Loney, a ranking Rotarian from the Rotary Club of Pakuranga and a senior executive at NZ Bakels Ltd. (As a top man at NZ Bakels Duncan gets to judge their annual Supreme Pie Awards...) However, Duncan Loney tonight was with us to explain his role





Together Lorelle & Duncan explained to us the concept & objectives of 'Pest Free Howick'. The PREDATOR essential core of creating a pest free Howick Ward over time is the idea of lending to residents suitable back yard traps for ensnaring rats, stoats (the worst),

ferrets, (mustelids) possums, even hedgehogs, borrowed from the 'Trap Library of East Auckland'. These traps have been funded by our Local Board & the aim is to have about 800 distributed throughout Howick Ward homes within 2 years. Already an increase in native birdlife is obvious where currently positioned pest traps stretch out along the 'bird corridor' emanating from the Bucklands Beach peninsular. (Even some Kaka have been seen.)

Current 'sponsors' include Lions clubs, Rotary clubs,







'Friends of Mangemangeroa' & our Local Howick Board, but these two very committed presenters tonight are seeking more physical help: - with flyer distribution, data capture & monitoring, pest trap distribution & project coordination. We may hear more detail going forward from our own PP Derek Miles who is already involved.

Pics from our visit to Pakuranga-Panmure Lions Club February 26, 2020

At Bucklands Beach Yacht Club, Half Moon Bay



Howick Lions and partners were 12 for dinner this evening with our Pakuranga-Panmure Lions hosts; (our 'mother' club). The evening was awash with fellowship & jolliness as old friends were greeted & new ones linked up, at a venue stylish & grand enough to host the Queen.

After dinner in the dining hall, (with a fine view of the super yachts in the marina), we retired upstairs to hear a presentation from Marty van der Burg of his experiences in Ethiopia with Habitat for Humanity, supported by his inspiring PowerPoint video. It was a totally captivating pleasure to



watch & listen to this enthusiastic, vivacious, erudite, articulate, experienced young (Kiwi-born) 'Hollander" who passionately told us about his extensive journey mentoring/sponsoring a young Ethiopian 'street boy' (named Eyayaw Biru) over a number of years visiting Ethiopia.

Marty van der Burg, had a long, personal association with both Ethiopia and Eyayaw. The pair met when Marty, a successful building company owner in New Zealand, was working with Habitat for Humanity in Ethiopia in 2007. (Marty van der Burg became earnestly involved with Habitat for Humanity on the TVNZ Paul Holmes show in 2004). The friendship which developed between Marty & the young



Ethiopian boy led Marty to encourage and support Eyayaw's studies and personal & business development over many years.

Together Marty and Eyayaw eventually created 'Eyayaw Tours Ethiopia' to showcase real, unique Ethiopia in a way that fully caters to the needs and expectations of foreign travellers - to the point that Marty could then 'walk away' from his 'sponsorship' of Eyayaw when the lad

was 28, having, graduated top student in business & tourism at the Maedot Tourist & Hotel Management College.


Marty felt his 'work' was now done. Clearly, Marty has supreme personal satisfaction in the outcome, and the difference he was able to make to this young 'street boy's' ongoing life, initially through Habitat for Humanity.

Welcome to Jan, who as a new Lion, was experiencing her first Howick Lions Club business meeting. Also, welcome back to PDG Alan Sheath. Alan's experienced counsel was once again a major contribution to the meeting's agenda.

We were reminded of the invitation from the Pakuranga-Panmure Lions Club to join them for dinner on Wednesday Feb 26 at the Bucklands Beach Yacht club. Our Howick club plans to have a good group of Lions attending.

We discussed the requests for money our Lions club regularly receives & were reminded that our discretionary funds are 'hard earned' & limited, and we need to identify 'real need' in all appeals from the public. (We developed a policy about this some time ago which may need to be revisited. Ed)

Our sponsored Outward Bound candidate did not turn up; at this stage we're not sure of the reason.

The issue of lower numbers at the 'Seniors Lunch' was raised, and a general view was that more contact & discussion with retirement village management/activity leaders may be helpful in gaining more support. It was also suggested we widen our advertising (invitation) campaign to extend awareness to Howick's mature citizen's market.

Ricky Singh (DG elect) from Pakuranga-Panmure Lions will provide a 'Lions orientation' presentation at our next dinner meeting in March.

Following the address from 'Pest Free NZ" at the last meeting Derek will develop a plan for our club support for local pest control with leaflet drops & trap distribution by specified areas.

HOWICK HISTORICAL VILLAGE




Krissy Perrett is the new General Manager of the Howick Historical Village.
