Jottings from the July 21st Business Meeting



Finance.

Subscriptions Subs for the 6 months 1/7/21 to 31/12/21 are recommended to remain at \$70.00 per member if paid by August 20. A surcharge of \$5 will apply after that date.

Budget 2021/2022 Special thanks to PP Paul Curtis for the development of this draft budget for the coming Lions year, with assistance from Grant Taylor et al. These provisional figures have been broadly based on past expenditure with a 'general roll-over' for the coming year. Current trends indicate sausage sales are down by about 50%. (Less foot traffic?) If schools provide their own chips, our Hot Chips turnover may be down. It was noted that final activity plans will modify these figures.

Updated Budget circulated by Lion Paul and added as an appendix in the minutes. Was not Moved and Seconded at the Business meeting so will need to be ratified at the next meeting.

Outward Bound

The policy of club contribution to Outward Bound candidates was widely discussed, with unanimous agreement to fund the Anakiwa course by 100% despite the draft budget showing a shortfall. The meeting decided that selected students would be required to pay some costs to ensure a positive commitment to the benefits of the OB program. Opinions were expressed on the selection channel (police, or a local school), but no decision was taken at this meeting to change from the current selection system (i.e., police). These OB policies would be subject to a year-on-year review.

IDEAS for the 2021-2022 Lions Year - President Judith Some suggestions were tabled, but time was against this item. Written suggestions will be sent to President Judith or PP Paul. e.g. Smaller / Cheaper / Iced Christmas cakes Pub Quiz style (sponsorships?) with sister Lions Clubs Beach Clean-up Tree Planting; etc, etc. (Many More – thank you. *The 'ideas group' will review & recommend). Note: Lions Club 'Service Awards' (LIONS internal project) to be considered in this mix. *NOTE: A sub-committee was formed to consider these ideas and projects for pre-evaluation, and to establish priorities, before making recommendations to full membership. "Ideas group" = President Judith, Paul Curtis, Brian Stocking, Alan Mead, Tina Singh.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including the club Lion of the Year, Club President's Award, the Robert J. Uplinger Service Award, several District Governor Appreciation Awards, and the Multiple District Membership Growth Award.
