In Memorium — Ian Packwood.

We reflect with great sadness on the passing of Past Council Chairman Ian Packwood—Packy to all of his friends at the age of 90.

Ian was a pillar of the Lions Club of Howick and Lions Clubs International for 56 years.

For good reason Packy was known as the "Lions—Lion". He lived and breathed Lions not only at Lions Events but in



everyday life. He was a true humanitarian, serving others before self.

Ian was one of natures true Gentlemen, I cannot think of a single occasion when he lost his temper or raised his voice in anger. He never spoke ill of anyone.

As Lions, we hold ourselves to the absolute highest standards in everything we do. We champion kindness in our communities and actively work to improve the lives of all people. Packy embodied these Lions Ethics in everything he did and with all those he encountered.

Ian was generous to a fault, he would give of his time generously to all who asked. He was tireless in assisting his community through his beloved Lions Club and amazed us all that at 90 years of age he was still one of the first to raise his hand and volunteer his services.

Over the last few years Ian has been a fantastic advocate for our youth and has worked tirelessly on Youth Projects such as Outward Bound; Young Speechmakers; Peace Poster and particularly liaising with Howick and Botany Colleges with regard to the Derek Wigzell Award.



The Global Lions Forum

The Global Lions Forum is an independent Facebook Group of almost 10,000 Lions members from all over the world. We discuss ways to strengthen Lions Clubs, improve club, zone, district and MD management, increase membership, and improve our communications using modern online tools and skills. We believe that by doing so, we will enrich our Lions experience, save time and money, accomplish more service, enjoy more diverse opinions, and have more fun! Members of the Forum span of all levels, from rank and file Lions Clubs members to LCI International Directors, both past and present.

The Forum was first established in 2017 as the Cyber Lions Facebook Group. The three founding members were Richard Stevenson (Tucson Cyber Lions Club, Pima County, Arizona), PDG Charles Short (Lafayette Lions Club, Indiana) and Paul Curtis (Howick Lions Club, New Zealand). The group quickly grew as Lions members found the Facebook group and then spread the word that there was a Forum, independent from Lions Clubs International, where they could have honest discussion of our challenges and opportunities within Lions, and where members are encouraged to bring their successes, insights, mistakes, outright failures, and experiences.

As the group grew, so did the need to bring in more help to manage volume of posts being submitted, and to maintain the group as a safe place for honest debate. On average the group has about 50 new posts and 1000 comments every week, with 14 moderators in the USA, UK, Greece, Macedonia, Sydney and New Zealand, and so it's truly become a group that never sleeps!





In June 2020, in recognition of their work to promote Lionism through the Global Lion Forum, the two founding members, Richard and Charles, were awarded the Lions Clubs International Presidential Leadership Medal, along with fellow admins:

- Paul Curtis (Howick Lions Club, New Zealand)
- Winster Ceballos (Passaic-Clifton Lions Club, USA)
- Daniel Marney Elkins (Bellefonte Lions Club, USA)
- Jodi Burmester (Madison Central Lions Club, USA)

The International Presidential Leadership Medal is the third highest award in LCI, for distinguished leadership.

Coronavirus (COVID19) Update:

Clubs transitioning to Alert Level 2:

This week the Government announced an adjustment to the restrictions under Alert Level 2, effective 11.59pm Tuesday 21 September.

In view of the above, please find the following:

Business and Dinner meetings:

- The number of people in a gathering has increased to 100. This means that Clubs can now come out of 'hibernation' and start having Business meetings – face to face at their appropriate venues.
- Please scan in using QR code at the venue or keep a record of members who have attended.
- Please remember to keep to the social distancing rule of 2m.

Masks to be worn at Business meetings.

Tables and chairs to be set up appropriately.

- Have hand sanitiser available for members to use.
- Respect members decision of not attending a meeting, or not to wear a mask for medical reasons.
- If a member is not feeling well, or has symptoms of a cold or flu, they should not attend.
- Meeting venues need to be wiped down prior to and after the meeting. (Check with the establishment if they charge extra as a decontamination fee).
- Meeting venues with access to Bar facilities: if the bar facility is at your Club venue one member at a time to be served. If the venue is at a public venue, then to have one person serving you at your table. (Please adhere to the venue's health and safety requirements).

All sub-committee meetings to adhere to the above.

- In respect to Dinner meetings, members need to be seated, separated and have one
- person serving your whole table. (No buffet dinner setting).
- Note: All members to follow safe, hygiene requirements.



Lions Meetings in COVID levels

Projects:

Community organisations can operate, and volunteers can resume their duties at Alert Level 2. However, everyone should do everything they can to reduce the risk of transmission. Where it applies, community organisations should follow the guidance that has been provided for businesses and guidance on gatherings.

- Volunteer organisations whose services involve close personal contact must keep contact tracing records.
- Volunteers should keep records of where they go, when they go there and who they meet.
- If you have cold or flu-like symptoms, stay home.

Keep a **<u>2 metre</u>** distance from others where possible.

Wash your hands regularly.

Reduce the number of shared surfaces, and regularly disinfect them.

- Minimise risk in all projects and follow appropriate protocols in respect to the COVID19 Health requirements. (i.e. social distancing, regular hand hygiene and cleaning of common Surfaces).
- If your project is an event involving a large group of people the numbers need to be kept within a maximum of 100.
- If your project involves serving the community, need to have hand sanitiser available for public use. Members need to use gloves where appropriate (i.e. taking money, handling food, taking tickets, or direct contact with the public), and have wipes and disinfectant spray available to wipe down surfaces on a regular basis. Remember social distancing needs to apply, **as well as members to wear masks.**
- Any project involving the public using pens, pencils, etc. These need to be wiped after every use.
